

National register of European Electronic Toll Service (EETS) domains and EETS providers

In accordance with Directive (EU) 2019/520 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the interoperability of electronic road toll systems, facilitating the cross-border exchange of information on cases of non-payment of road tolls within the Union:

‘European Electronic Toll Service (EETS)’ means the toll service provided under a contract on one or more EETS domains by an EETS provider to an EETS user;

‘EETS domain’ means a road, a road network, a structure, such as a bridge or a tunnel, or a ferry, where tolls are collected using an electronic road toll system;

‘EETS provider’ means an entity which, under a separate contract, grants access to EETS to an EETS user, transfers the tolls to the relevant toll charger, and which is registered by its Member State of establishment;

‘EETS user’ means a natural or legal person who has a contract with an EETS provider in order to have access to the EETS.

The register shall contain information relating to:

- 1) the EETS domain(-s):
 - the corresponding toll chargers;
 - the tolling technologies employed;
 - the toll context data;
 - the EETS domain statement;
 - the EETS providers having EETS contracts with the toll chargers active in the territory of that Member State.
- 2) the EETS provider(-s) to whom it has granted registration in accordance with Article 4 of Directive (EU) 2019/520.

EETS domains Register

Periodicity of the information to be updated.

When the EETS domain(-s) or EETS provider is registered in Latvia, the State Limited Liability Company Latvian State Roads will enter this information in the register and publish this information.
